

The top middle-skill jobs in the Atlanta region chart includes specific middle-skill jobs. The color of the bar corresponds to which job-family the job falls into. At the end of the bar is the median hourly wage, meaning half of the people who do that job make more, and half make less, regardless of education or experience. Job titles new to the top ten jobs are in bold.
